Psalm 42:1-2, 5-8 (New Revised Standard Version)

As a deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and behold the face of God? Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my help and my God. My soul is cast down within me; therefore I remember you from the land of Jordan and of Hermon, from Mount Mizar. Deep calls to deep at the thunder of your cataracts; all your waves and your billows have gone over me. By day the Lord commands his steadfast love, and at night his song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life.

Luke 5:1-11 (New Revised Standard Version)

Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a

sinful man!" For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.





The American Guild of Organists


Visiting organist John Dixon will present a recital of organ music in our sanctuary on Sunday, February 16, 2025, at 3 pm. The program will consist of a variety of his compositions including hymn-based and patriotic material and folk songs from the British Isles and the U.S. Of special note is one of his newer compositions, Four New Mexico Folk Songs, which will be played in its world premiere performance as part of the program.

With nearly 1,000 compositions to his credit, his current project is to visit and present a recital in each of the 50 states. This recital will make New Mexico the 41st state in the series.

Dixon is Organist at Providence Presbyterian Church in Virginia Beach, Virginia, and the Executive Director of the Academy of Music in Norfolk, Virginia. He is also the National Treasurer of the American Guild of Organists.

The event is sponsored by the Las Cruces Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and is free and

open to the public.
